# TRACKING THE NANOQ FOOTSTEPS: THE ARCTIC KING



Snowmobile expedition in mythical Northwest Passage to watch and photograph polar bears with an Inuit guide

400 Kilometers of snowmobile crossing through the key point of the legendary Northwest Passage in northern Canada. Guided by an experienced Inuit, who was born in an igloo, we will cross the frozen Barrow and Lancaster Straits. A frozen ice sea zone where pressure ridges and plains of ice follow one after other.

Departing from Resolute, base of many sports expeditions to the North Pole Geographic, our goal is to achieve the polynia, an area ofsea that never freezes, located near Devon Island. This polynia is rich in wildlife where it is common to find seals and their natural predator, the polar bear, a marvel of adaptation to arctic climate and terrain.

On our route we will stop at Beechy Island, an archaeological site where the remains of ill-fated expedition of Sir John Franklin, the source of much of the American High Arctic exploration. After observing and photographing extensively polar bears and other Arctic wildlife we will head to Cape Sherard, the entry point of the Northwest Passage, where it is easy to find muskoxen.

We will return to Resolute along the coast of Somerset Island through spectacular gorges and cutting rock canyons. Before arriving in Resolute we will visit the Canadian Military Survival School, where the Canadian Air Force learns polar survival techniques taught by our Inuit guide. Right there we can build an igloo with our Inuit teacher and sleep in the snow shelter warmed by a traditional seal oil lamp.

## **TRAVEL PROGRAM**

#### Day 1

Flight to Ottawa. Overnight at hotel.

## Day 2

Flight Ottawa - Resolute. Overnight at hotel.

## Day 3

Day in Resolute to prepare the equipment, learning the use of snowmobiles and visit the village. Overnight at hotel.

## Day 4

Load all gear, food, fuel and equipment on sleds. Starting of the trip in Resolute to go through the Barrow Strait to Beechy Island, where we will sleep in the same place where wintered the expedition of Sir John Franklin over 150 years ago. Overnight in tent.

## Day 5

We will continue our journey along the south coast of Devon Island until the polynia located in its vicinity, located in the Lancaster Strait. Overnight in tent on the frozen sea.

## Days 6 to 11

We will look for polar bears with the help of our Inuit guide to photograph and observe them closely. In our route we will reach Cape Sherard, the eastern tip of Devon Island and the Northwest Passage entrance. A place where we can easily find one of the most elusive animals in the Arctic: the musk ox. Overnight in tent on the frozen sea.

## Day 12

Return to Resolute Bay along the coast of Somerset Island. This day we will travel with snowmobiles along spectacular snowy ravines and canyons. Before arriving in Resolute we will visit the Canadian Military Survival School, where the Canadian Air Force learns polar survival techniques taught by our Inuit guide. Right there we can build an igloo with our Inuit teacher Inuit and sleep in the snow shelter warmed by a traditional seal oil lamp.

## Day 13

Arrival in Resolute Bay and time to relax and quietly visit this small population of 200 Inuit. Overnight at hotel.

## Day 14

Free time in Resolute. Overnight at hotel.

## Day 15

Flight Resolute - Ottawa. Overnight at hotel.

# Day 16

Flight Ottawa - home.

This trip is an expedition where unforeseen circumstances may occur and therefore the program is subject to change on the ground for weather reasons, logistical matters, ice and snow conditions or force majeure.

# NOTES

- During the route every traveler will go with her or his own snowmobile.
- Group from 6 to 8 people.
  Due to severe limitations on aircraft weight, it is important not to carry as personal baggage over 15 kilos per person.
